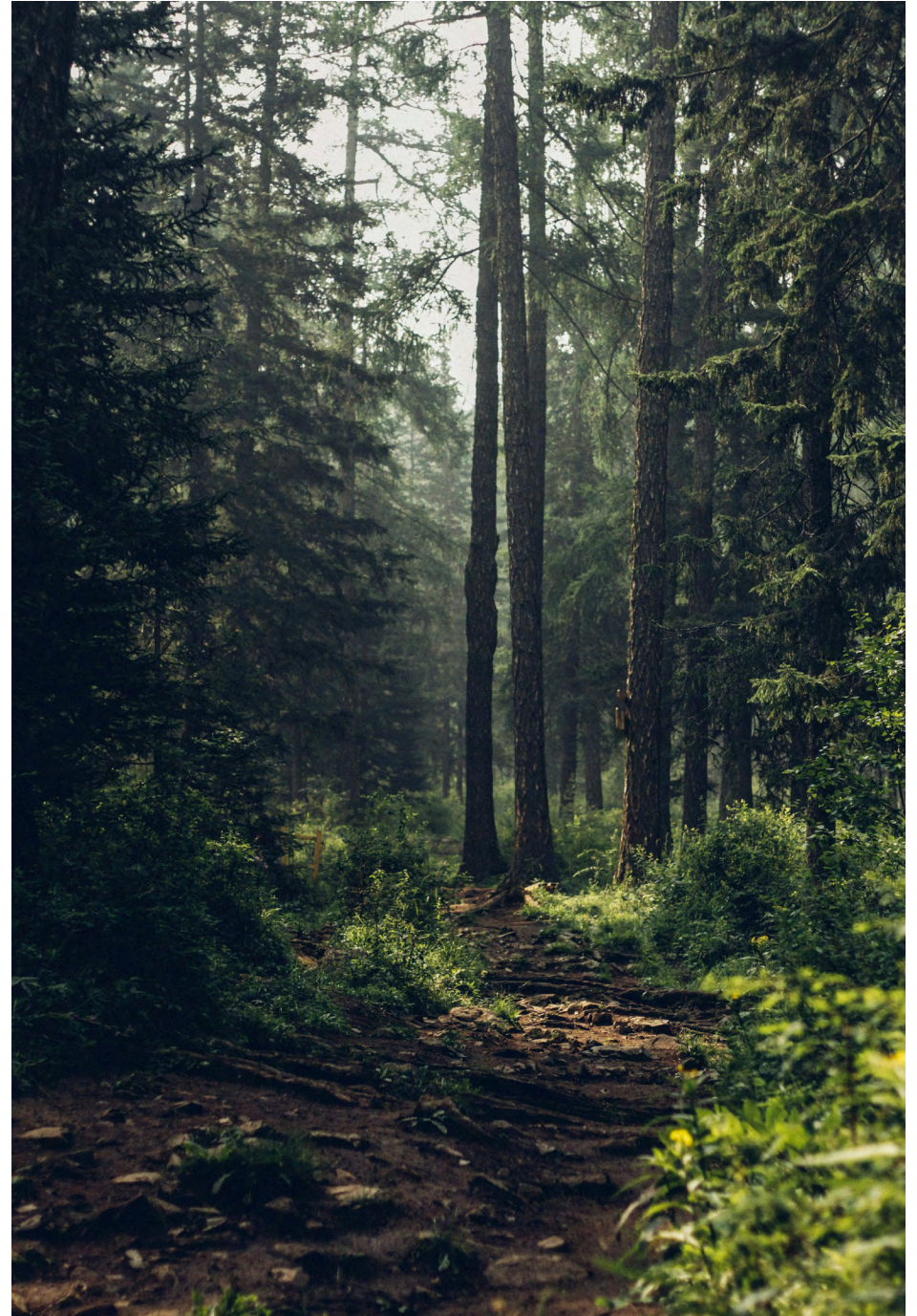

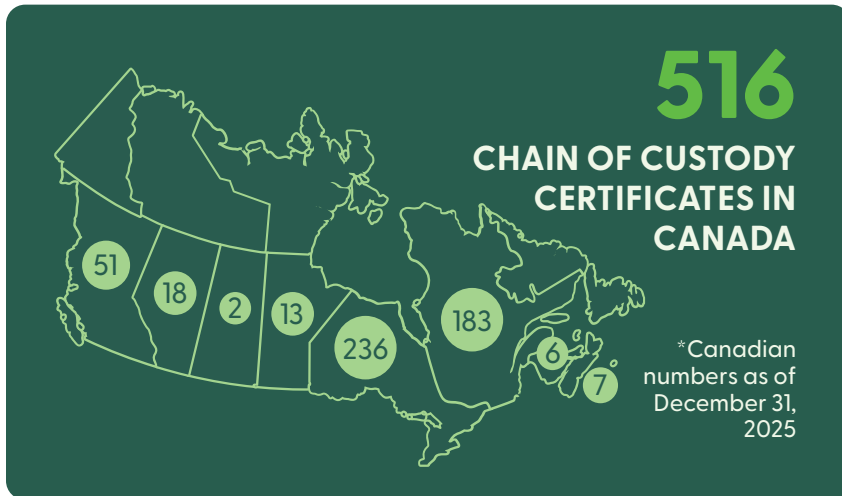

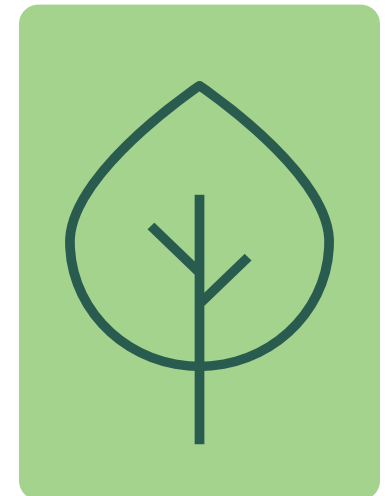

Honouring Indigenous Leadership and Stewardship at Earth Week: Reflections from Menominee Territory

Indigenous leaders from Canada joined Menominee Tribal Enterprises and the Milwaukee School of Engineering during Earth Week 2025 to celebrate the FSC Leadership Award for The Giving Forest Game, a digital learning tool rooted in Menominee forest values. The visit included a tour of the 230,000-acre FSC-certified Menominee Forest, where the delegation saw firsthand how the Nation's "forest-first" approach sustains ecological integrity, cultural connection, and economic self-determination. The week concluded with a Peace Tree planting and reflections on how Indigenous knowledge, stewardship, and intergenerational responsibility continue to guide the future of forest management across North America.

FSC at the 2025 Indigenous Lands Symposium

FSC Canada joined Indigenous leaders, knowledge holders, and partners at the Indigenous Lands Symposium in Bawating/Sault Ste. Marie to deepen dialogue on Indigenous-led forest stewardship. The team listened, learned, and shared how FSC certification supports Indigenous rights and embeds Free, Prior, and Informed Consent (FPIC) into forest management.

Conversations highlighted priorities such as ecosystem conservation, climate resilience, Guardian programs, and the need for stronger support for Indigenous-led initiatives. Cultural teachings and ceremonies grounded the week, reinforcing the importance of time on the land and relationships with all living beings. The insights gained will guide FSC Canada's ongoing work to strengthen partnerships and advance Indigenous-led conservation.



How Forestry is Supporting Biodiversity in Northumberland County

In Northumberland County, forestry is helping bring rare ecosystems back to life. Through careful thinning, prescribed burns, and FSC-certified practices, the team is restoring tallgrass prairie, oak savanna, and the species that depend on them. A century of stewardship—and the nighthawks are returning.

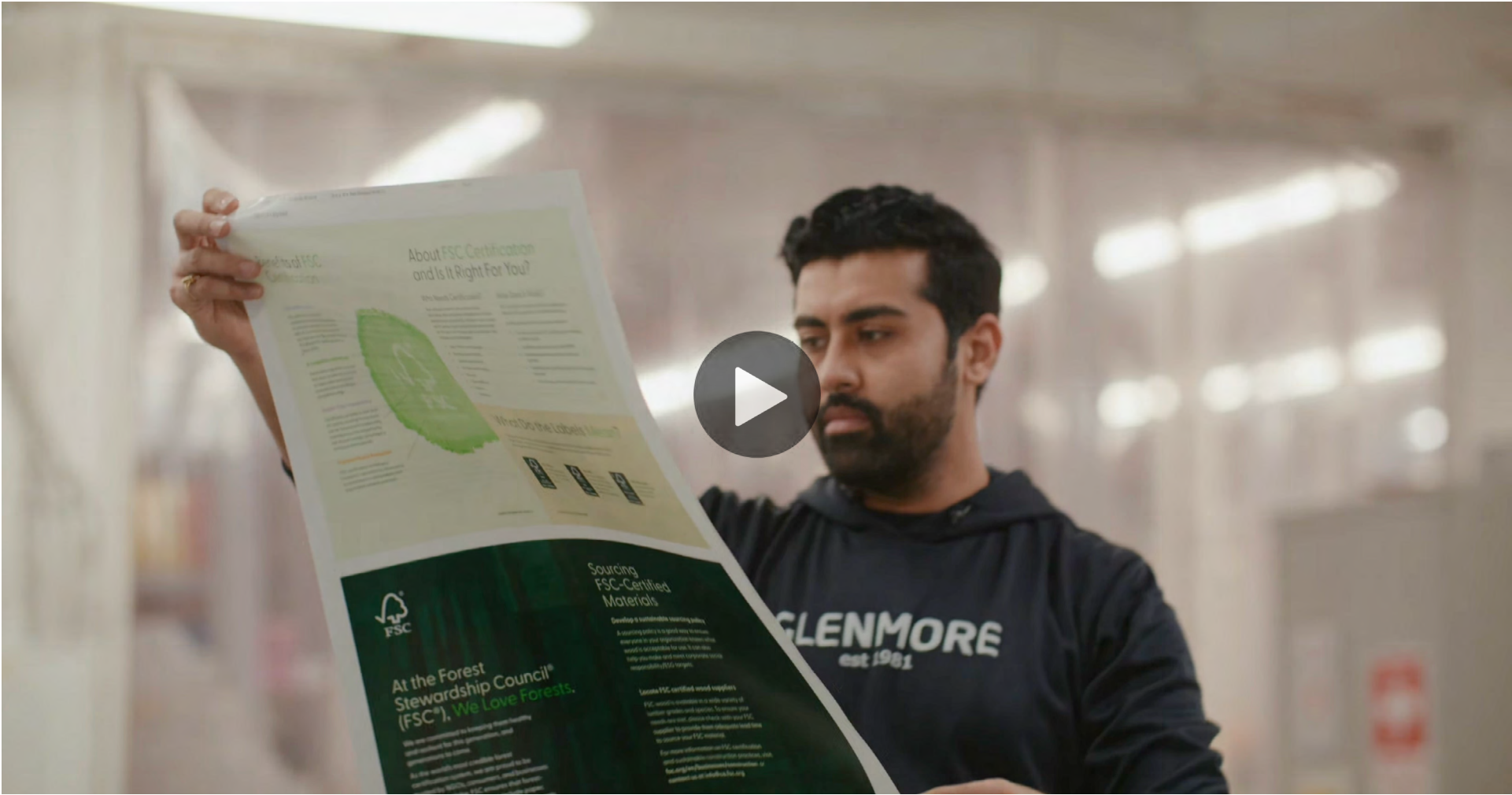

Study Confirms FSC Certification Contributes to Maintaining and Increasing Forest Cover

Research from The Journal of Cleaner Production shows that FSC certification is linked to growing and protecting forest cover across 70 countries. The findings highlight FSC's value in sustainable forest management and reinforce the need for region-specific strategies to scale certification and combat deforestation.

FSC Canada Launches Practical Guidebook to Support Smallholders and Community Forests

FSC Canada has released a new Guidebook to help smallholders and community forests navigate FSC certification with confidence. It breaks down the SLIMF+CF Standard into clear, simple summaries and highlights what to expect during certification.



Public Consultation of Draft Indicators for Intact Forest Landscapes

FSC Canada conducted a public consultation on new draft Indicators for Intact Forest Landscapes from August 1 to September 30, 2025. These indicators guide how FSC-certified forests manage large, undisturbed areas that are vital for biodiversity, carbon storage, and Indigenous cultural values.



Indigenous Cultural Landscapes

FSC Canada led a consultation on how Indigenous Cultural Landscapes (ICLs) will be integrated into the National Forest Stewardship Standard (NFSS). This work advances Motion 23 and builds on extensive knowledge shared by partners, including The Firelight Group, Wahkohtowin Development GP Inc., the Indigenous Peoples Chamber, SDG members, and Dr. M.A. (Peggy) Smith. The consultation focuses solely on adding ICL requirements to the NFSS and does not involve changes to Principle 3 at this stage.

Global Consultation for Revision of FSC's Chain of Custody Standards was Conducted

FSC released a draft revised Chain of Custody Standards and opened a public consultation. Stakeholders were invited to review the updates and share feedback to help shape the future of FSC CoC certification. A webinar with French translation was also held in December for those wanting to learn more about the process.



Principles and Criteria

The first public consultation of the Conceptual phase of the Principles, Criteria and Indicators (PCI) revision started on October 1, 2025. The revision of the FSC Principles and Criteria (P&C), International Generic Indicators (IGI), and other normative documents (collectively referred to as PCI) represents a key opportunity to integrate outcome orientation and streamline the requirements for forest management certification.

FSC Canada at Toronto Climate Week

FSC Canada helped power the first-ever Toronto Climate Week as both a sponsor and contributor, with Monika Patel joining the Natural World Panel to highlight how responsible forest management, Indigenous rights, and nature-based solutions are central to Canada's climate leadership. The week showcased the growing momentum behind collaborative, ecosystem-driven climate action - and FSC was proud to help drive the conversation.



FSC Canada Highlights AI-Driven Sustainability at Toronto Climate Week with Salesforce

FSC Canada joined Salesforce's Toronto Climate Week event on how AI can strengthen sustainability strategies, sharing how our collaboration through the Agents for Impact Accelerator is using Agentic AI to reduce barriers to certification and make responsible forest management more accessible.

Forests as Climate Solutions: Building Resilience Through Collaboration

CLIMATE MEETINGS IN OTTAWA, VANCOUVER, AND EDMONTON

In 2025, FSC Canada brought together Indigenous leaders, environmental organizations, forestry practitioners, academics, and policy experts across the country to explore one big question - how can responsible forest management help Canada meet its climate and biodiversity goals?

These efforts form part of the Forests as Climate Solutions project, generously supported by Environment and Climate Change Canada (ECCC). The project focuses on how FSC-certified forests can build resilience to climate change, contribute to carbon storage, and strengthen biodiversity – helping forests continue to do what they do best: sustain life.

LISTENING AND LEARNING TOGETHER

Throughout the year, FSC Canada hosted four leadership discussions – in Ottawa, Vancouver, and Alberta – each designed to explore a specific piece of the forest–climate puzzle.

At the Indigenous Land Symposium in February, FSC Canada, Wahkohtowin Development Group, and the Indigenous Foundation co-hosted a dialogue with Indigenous resource and land managers. The session provided space for communities to share priorities, approaches, and challenges related to forest stewardship and climate resilience. Participants discussed how FSC certification can better reflect Indigenous values and decision-making, while FSC had the opportunity to listen and learn from those leading the way on the ground.

Later that month in Ottawa, conversations turned toward Other Effective Area-based Conservation Measures (OECMs) – a key pathway to advancing Canada’s 30x30 biodiversity target. Representatives from Indigenous organizations, ENGOs, industry, and governments worked together to identify how FSC-certified forests could support OECMs and where stronger collaboration could help build confidence

in results. The group also highlighted the importance of Indigenous leadership in future OECM development.

The following day, FSC Canada convened another Ottawa leadership discussion, this time exploring the growing world of nature finance. Participants from finance, forestry, Indigenous leadership, and mining explored how FSC tools and standards can help unlock investment in forest-based projects that deliver both environmental and social impact. A major takeaway: partnerships that align with Indigenous priorities are not only essential for equity – they also strengthen the credibility and long-term success of forest investments.

Finally, in Vancouver, FSC hosted a two-day Forests as Climate Solutions Forum, bringing together nearly 30 participants in person and virtually. The national dialogue dove deeper into how FSC’s standards, and Climate and Landscape Solutions program can drive progress on adaptation, mitigation, and biodiversity conservation. From identifying new opportunities to expand carbon-positive management practices to sharing community-driven approaches to forest stewardship, the engagement reaffirmed the value of working across sectors – and across cultures – to find shared solutions.

SHARED INSIGHTS, SHARED PURPOSE

Across all sessions, a few key themes emerged:

- Indigenous leadership and knowledge are central to effective, climate-resilient forest management.
- Collaboration – between governments, industry, communities, and NGOs – is essential to build trust and accelerate progress.
- Financial mechanisms and policy frameworks must evolve to reward sustainable practices and community benefits.
- FSC’s standards and tools can play a pivotal role in connecting these pieces – linking certification, conservation, and climate action into one coherent path forward.

As these insights continue to shape FSC Canada’s work, one thing remains clear: Canada’s forests are a powerful part of the climate solution, and collaboration is the key to unlocking their potential.

Forest Tour 2025: Bringing FSC Certification to Life in Timmins, Ontario

GreenFirst Forest Products, a leading lumber producer based in Timmins, Ontario, manages FSC-certified forests where sustainability, regeneration, and long-term forest health guide every decision. Their forestry team, led locally by Chief Forester Chris McDonell, turns FSC principles into practical on-the-ground stewardship, making GreenFirst a natural partner for FSC Canada in showcasing responsible forestry in action at our Forest Tour 2025.

The FSC Canada Forest Tour program is designed to educate participants and demonstrate the exceptional value and positive impact that FSC certification has at the forestry level. By bringing people directly into certified forests and facilities, the program helps bridge the gap between policy, procurement decisions, and the realities of sustainable forest management on the ground.

From September 29 to October 1, GreenFirst and FSC Canada co-hosted a two-day forest and mill tour in the Timmins area, designed to bring the FSC story to life for a diverse group of guests. Architects, developers, food manufacturers, along with the chain of custody manager from Pirelli (who are already using FSC-certified rubber in their P Zero line of tires), joined FSC Canada for an immersive look at how certified forests are planned, harvested, and renewed.

The tour began with an introduction to both organizations and to the forest sector in northern Ontario, setting the stage for what participants would see in the field. Out in the forest, Chris and his team expertly guided guests through active operations and regenerating stands, explaining harvest planning, wildlife and water protections, and how FSC standards help keep their forests resilient and renewing. Standing among tall boreal trees and freshly planted seedlings, visitors were able to ask candid questions and see firsthand what “responsible forestry” looks like beyond a label.

A visit to the GreenFirst sawmill completed the journey from forest to finished product. Guests watched FSC-certified logs arrive, move through debarking and sawing, and emerge as structural lumber, while learning how chain-of-custody systems keep certified material clearly identified along the way.

Throughout the two days, conversations were lively, practical, and often eye-opening, with feedback from our guests being overwhelmingly positive. Many left with new insights, a stronger appreciation for FSC certification at the forest level, and renewed commitment to specifying and sourcing FSC-certified products - proof that time spent together in the forest can powerfully strengthen support for responsible forestry.

RONA Becomes First Home Improvement and Construction Retailer on DoorDash in Canada

RONA has partnered with DoorDash to offer fast, on-demand delivery from nearly 200 stores, giving Canadians quicker access to home improvement products - sometimes in under an hour. As an FSC Promotional Licence Holder, RONA can also spotlight FSC-certified options in these digital channels, making it easier for shoppers to choose responsibly sourced products while enjoying seamless, convenient delivery.



Recent Consumer Study Shows Consumer Awareness of FSC in Canada is Increasing

FSC's 2025 global survey shows climate concern declining worldwide – including in Canada – even as Canadians cite wildfires (46%) as their top forestry worry. While war and conflict now dominate global public concern, consumers continue to prefer sustainable products and trust brands that can demonstrate real impact. The findings reveal a widening disconnect: climate feels less urgent and abstract, yet people remain deeply concerned about biodiversity loss and expect companies to avoid deforestation. These insights shaped discussions at the FSC General Assembly. At the same time, **public recognition of FSC is rising, with consumer awareness increasing by 8% in 2025, with 42% of Canadians now reporting familiarity with the FSC label** – a signal of growing visibility and value for brands, retailers, and consumers alike.

FSC Canada Expands Industry Presence Through Strategic Event Engagement

In 2025, FSC Canada strengthened its presence across key sectors by showing up where the conversations about sustainable materials, responsible sourcing, and the future of forest-based products were happening. From Woodrise in Vancouver to the Mass Timber Conference in Seattle, DesignThinkers in Toronto, the Montreal Wood Convention, and BUILDDEX Vancouver, FSC engaged directly with architects, builders, designers, manufacturers, and supply-chain leaders who shape how wood and forest-based materials are used across Canada and beyond.

At these events, FSC Canada's Market Development Manager played a central role—building relationships with industry leaders, supporting companies interested in responsible sourcing, and helping grow both Chain of Custody certificate holders and Promotional Licence holders. These touchpoints helped reinforce FSC's leadership in sustainable forest management and expanded the network of organizations committed to the sustainable sourcing of forest products.

Jaguar Land Rover First to Launch Tires with Over 70% Renewable and Recycled Materials

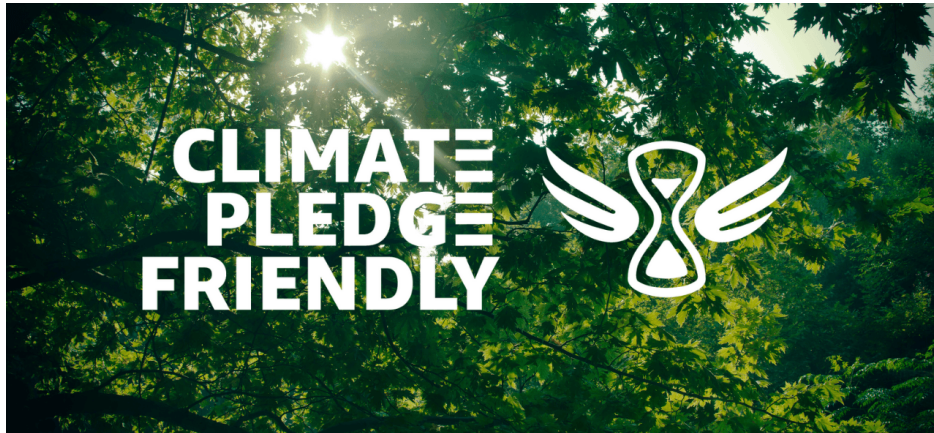
Jaguar Land Rover is introducing new Pirelli tires made with over 70% renewable and recycled materials, including FSC-certified natural rubber—an industry first. The tires will debut on select New Range Rover models this year, advancing both companies' commitments to responsible sourcing. Pirelli aims to use only FSC-certified natural rubber in its European factories by 2026, and both partners are working toward tires made entirely from renewable and recycled materials.



Beauty and Wellness Webinar

FSC Canada and FSC U.S. co-hosted a Beauty & Wellness webinar in September to help brands and retailers strengthen responsible sourcing and improve consumer communication around FSC-certified products. The session offered a clear overview of the Promotional Licence Holder program, practical guidance on using FSC trademarks, and real-world insights from existing licence holders on integrating FSC into packaging and marketing. With strong engagement and questions throughout, the webinar reinforced FSC's role as a partner to businesses seeking credible, effective sustainability communication.

FSC-Certified Products Now Featured in Amazon Canada's Climate Pledge Friendly Program

FSC Canada is now featured in Amazon Canada's Climate Pledge Friendly program, making it easier for shoppers to find products backed by credible, responsible forest management. As the only forest-focused certification in the program, FSC gives consumers a clear way to choose sustainably sourced goods while helping certified businesses gain visibility and trust. Products with the CPF badge see higher page views, stronger customer confidence, and increased switching toward more sustainable options. FSC-certified items with on-product labels, sold by certificate or promotional licence holders on Amazon.ca, are now eligible - opening the door for more Canadians to support forests through everyday purchases.



FSC Forest Week: Global Impact at a Glance

Our 2025 campaign delivered record-breaking engagement, generating over 140 million impressions and attracting participants from more than 70 countries including Canada. The FSC Brand Hub played a central role, driving 78% of all registrations.

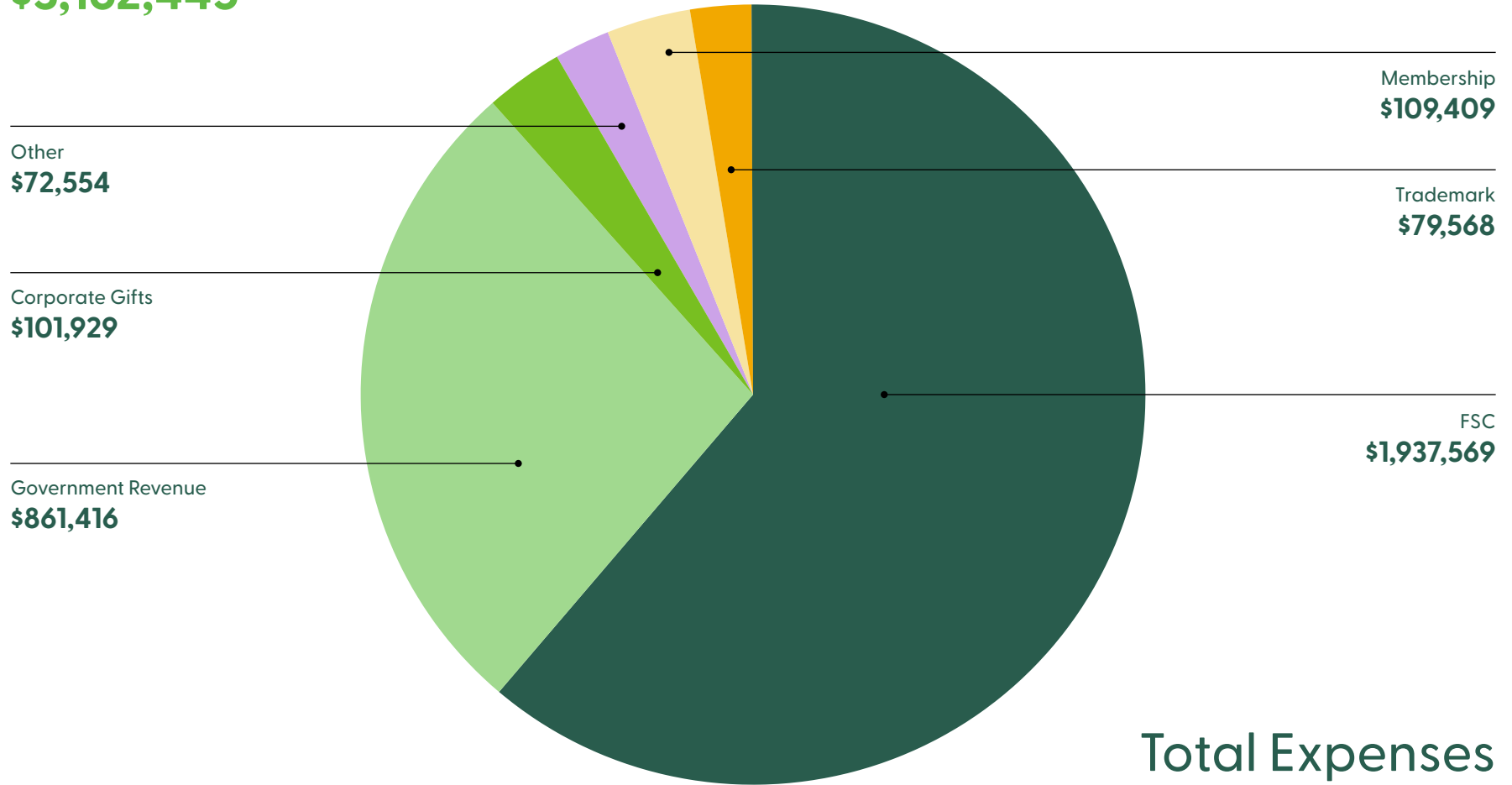

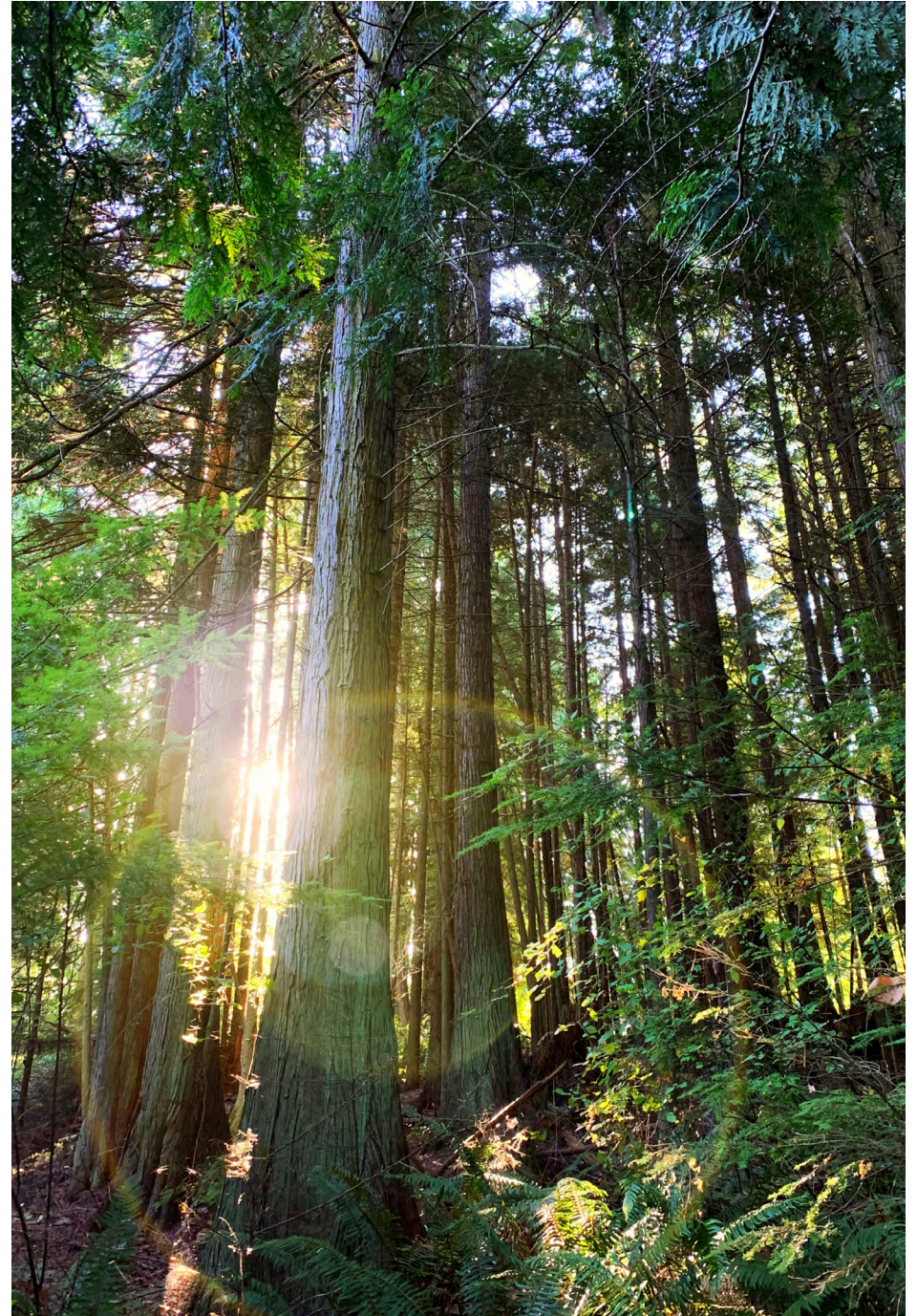
With Gratitude to Our Community
